

Membership Advancement

Happy Fall Rochester ASHRAE,

I'm looking forward to working as the membership promotion (MP) chair this year. I recent had the opportunity to attend the 2017 CRC membership promotion workshop in Long Island on 8/19. The workshop was excellent and fun was had by all during the event. In this month's newsletter, I'd like to point out the different membership grades and the advantages associated with each grade.

There are four grades that I'd like to focus on, member, associate, affiliate, and student. Student and affiliate grades are excellent introductions into ASHRAE. The joining cost is discounted by the society and provide several of the same benefits as the member and associate grade.

The qualifications for student grade are simple. Applicant must be studying or have an interest in an HVAC&R industry-related field and matriculated in an approved course of study in the arts and sciences covered by the Society's objectives. This grade is designed for all engineering students who are considering a career in HVAC. The cost is \$ 21.00 annually and student members are given the opportunity to transfer to Associate grade membership after graduation using the SmartStart program. This grade does not allow you to hold office or vote. You also will not have access to the ASHRAE handbook. The link for the online registration is https://join.ashrae.org/

If you are not a student and would like to get involved with ASHRAE, the affiliate program is a great way. This is a three year tier program, which is also discounted. The first year dues are \$ 52.00, the second year is \$ 78.00, and the third year is \$ 103.00. This grade does not allow you to hold office or vote. You also will not have access to the ASHRAE handbook. The link for the online registration is <u>https://join.ashrae.org/</u>

The next level of grade is associate. The level has all the benefits of a full membership and is the same cost of \$ 203.00 per year. You can hold associate grade for as long as you'd like, however after 12 years of Society approved experience you can upgrade to member.

Once you have the twelve years of Society approved experience, advancement to member is easy. First, you must update your bio on the ASHRAE website. Once updated you must notify <u>membership@ashrae.org</u> that you wish to be considered for grade advancement. *Please include your ASHRAE membership number in the subject header of this email.

Steps for updating your biography:

- 1. Log into www.ashrae.org by selecting 'Join or Login' in the upper right corner. Enter your email address and password then select 'Sign In.'
- 2. Click "My Account" once logged in on the upper right corner.

- 3. Under 'Biographical Info' you can add all of your educational history, relevant professional licenses and work history.
- 4. Confirm that your contact information is current by clicking on 'Contact Info.'
